Nomination Guidelines for SFRR-I Trevor Slater Award Lecture 2025

We are seeking nominations for the SFRR – International Trevor Slater Award Lecture 2025 to be given at the 22nd SFRR – International Biennial Meeting (hosted by SFRR-Europe) in the University of Galway, Ireland 3-6 June 2025. The Trevor Slater Award is the highest award of SFRR – International and is awarded on a biennial basis to a scientist who, in the judgment of the International Scientific Committee, has made an outstanding contribution to the field. It was set up in memory of Trevor Slater, a founder and first President of the Society. The award consists of a medal and certificate, and it is a requirement that the recipient presents a lecture at the Biennial meeting where the award is made and subsequently contributes an invited Review Article to Free Radical Biology & Medicine.
